Overview of Common Nursing Roles

Assistant/Technician: Narrow scope of work. Provides basic patient care under supervision, assisting with daily activities and monitoring health. Examples include nursing assistant, emergency room technician, and phlebotomist. Licensing typically requires completion of a certificate program.

Practical Nurse (PN): Delivers direct patient care under supervision, focusing on hands-on skills and patient interaction. Licensing requires completion of an Associate of Applied Science in Practical Nursing degree.

Registered Nurse (RN): Coordinates patient care, administers medications, educates patients, and collaborates with healthcare providers. Licensing requires completion of an Associates Degree in Nursing or an Bachelors of Science in Nursing degree.

Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA): Administers anesthesia and monitors patients during surgery for safe pain management. Licensing requires completion of a CRNA program. Admission into a CRNA program typically requires 1-3 years of experience as an RN working in the ICU at a level 1 or 2 trauma hospital, like Harborview.

Nurse Practitioner (NP): Diagnoses and treats illnesses, prescribes medications, and educates patients, often specializing in specific areas. Licensing requires completion of a masters or doctoral program.

Nursing Specialties

Once an individual achieves nursing licensure, specialization often occurs through on-the-job training, experience, and further education, such as advanced practice nursing programs like a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) or a Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP), offering specialized coursework and clinical experiences.

Emergency Room & Patient Care Technician

Common Job Duties: Measure vital signs, assist with daily activities, document care, provide support, perform assessments, assist in trauma care including wound care and splinting, help with medical procedures, and prioritize patient care.

English proficiency.

EKG Technician

Common Job Duties: Operate EKG machines, monitor signals for quality, troubleshoot technical issues, analyze readings for abnormalities, and accurately document EKG data, communicating with patient care teams.

Nursing Assistant

Common Job Duties: Helps with daily activities, records vital signs, assists with feeding, communicates with patients and the healthcare team, and documents care activities.

Phlebotomy

Common Job Duties: Greet and explain procedures to patients, perform venipuncture, collect blood specimens, adhere to infection control protocols, maintain equipment, and follow guidelines for accurate test results.

Bachelors of Science in Nursing

Equips students for careers as Bachelor's prepared Registered Nurses through a 90-credit curriculum, including classroom and lab experiences, leading to eligibility for the NCLEX-RN. Graduates benefit from improved job prospects, career advancement opportunities, and preparation for advanced degrees, enhancing patient care outcomes and autonomy in nursing practice.

Requirements: Unencumbered practical nursing license. Up-to-date on immunizations; GRC Nursing does not grant religious or philosophical exemptions. Successful completion of all prerequisite courses; 1 course may be outstanding at the time of application.

Associate of Applied Science in Practical Nursing

Prepares students for careers as licensed practical nurses through a 90-credit program, of which 45 credits are prerequisites. Graduates can sit for the NCLEX-PN for licensure. The program offers job security, a pathway into nursing, the ability to bridge into ADN or BSN programs, and the opportunity to start working in as little as 2 years.

MA-C Option: Certified medical assistants eligible to earn 2 credits for work experience, after completing skills test with faculty.

Requirements: Up-to-date on immunizations; GRC Nursing does not grant religious or philosophical exemptions. Successful completion of all prerequisite courses; 1 course may be outstanding at the time of application.

Associates of Pre-Nursing

Enables students to transfer seamlessly to BSN programs in Washington State by fulfilling foundational coursework requirements, including completing 90-91 guarter credits with a minimum GPA of 2.0 and meeting specific distribution criteria, with potential GPA standards set by nursing programs. Completion of this program does not qualify students for licensure in nursing.

Immunizations & Medical Tests

Participants in all of Green River's Nursing programs, except for Phlebotomy, must complete all required immunizations and medical tests. No exemptions are allowed, including for philosophical, religious, or medical reasons. A titer, as mentioned below, is a blood test used to check immunity to specific diseases.




