CLASS TYPE DEFINITION

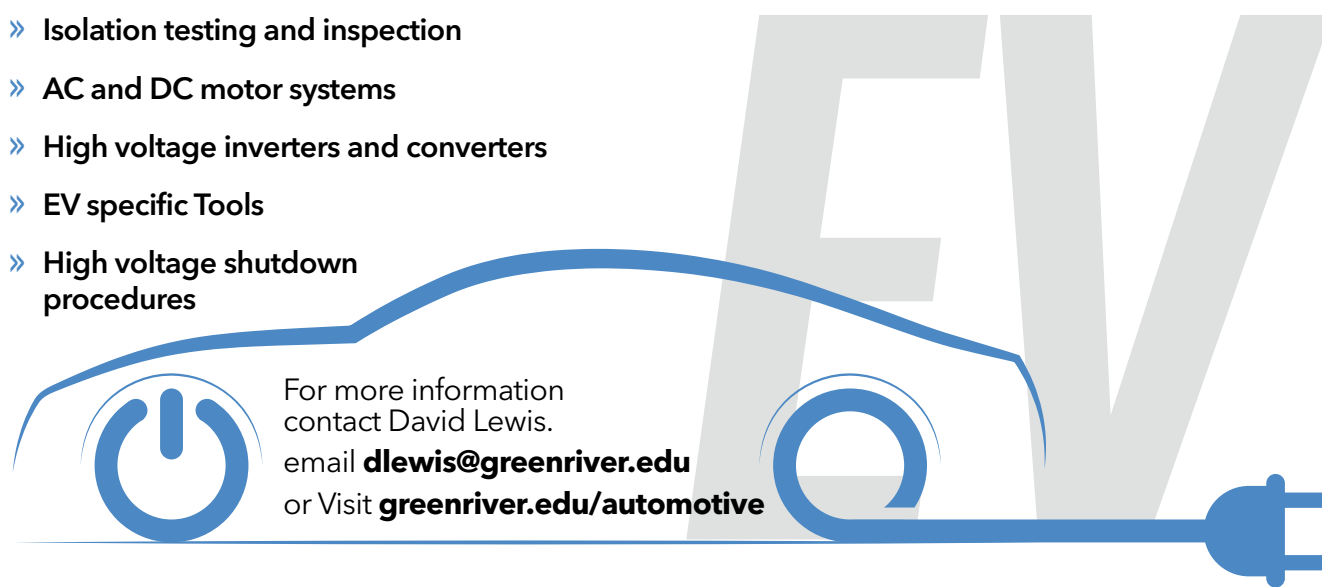

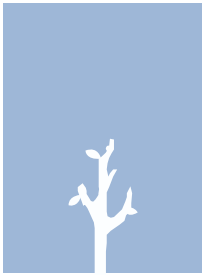
